



## Missing Adult Alert Criteria

- Local investigating law enforcement agency confirms the individual is missing.
- The individual is 65 years of age or older, or has a mental impairment.
- The disappearance of the individual poses a credible threat of immediate danger of serious bodily harm or death to the individual.
- There is sufficient descriptive information about the individual and the circumstances surrounding the individual's disappearance to indicate that activation of the alert will help to locate the individual.

If the criteria are met,  
**ACTIVATE THE MISSING ADULT  
ALERT NOW!**
